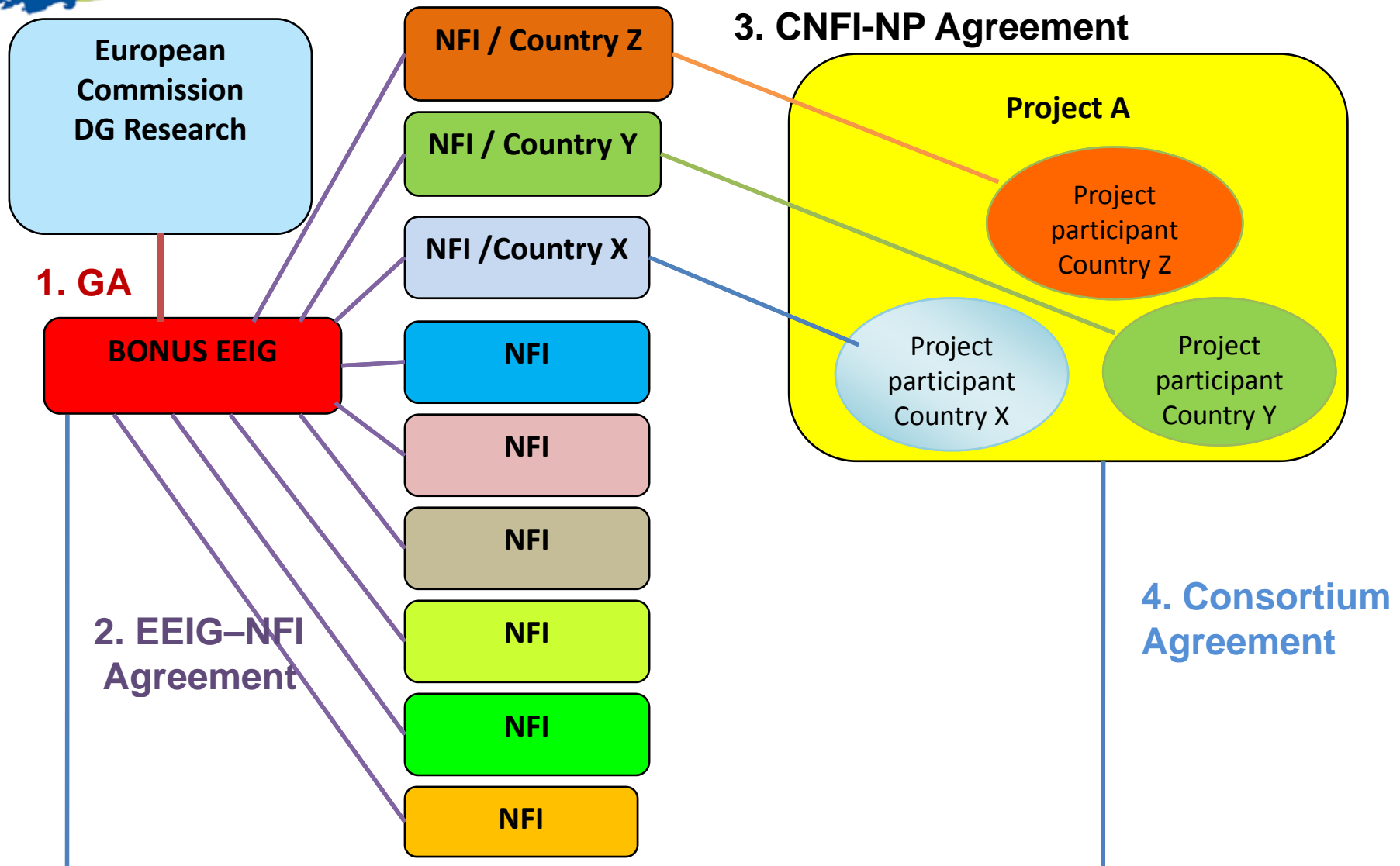

From the impact perspective...

- for ensuring the creation of the added value – guidance and obligation to scientists to create added value through coordination actions
- for ensuring the demonstration the impact of BONUS-169 by measurable indicators

FOR WHOM?

- To be concluded with **each project**
- BONUS EEIG will be one of the contracting parties in the CA

CONTENT

- Regulatory provisions (e.g. Grant Agreement between BONUS EEIG and COM)
- Rights and responsibilities of the partners
- Project Management (e.g. Steering Group)
- Data Management (e.g. Data Policy Statement)
- BONUS EEIG participation: Programme Scientific Coordinator

WHEN?

- Currently under the lawyer's check – to be finalised in January
- Approval by the SC – right after the check
- Contracting to be started in February
