RISKGOV conference on Coping with Uncertainty 15-17 November 2009

The BONUS RISKGOV project will arrange a research conference on 'Coping with Uncertainty - A Multidisciplinary Research Conference on Risk Governance in the Baltic Sea Region' in Stockholm on 15-17 November 2009. The conference will combine keynotes by leading scholars and practitioners with presentations and discussions in thematic workshops. The aim of the conference is to discuss implications of uncertainty at science-policy interfaces connected with environmental, social and economic risks in the Baltic Sea Region. Authors are invited to submit abstracts for oral presentations relating to coping with uncertainty in general and to individual workshops in particular. Scientists, experts, practitioners and stakeholders interested in science-policy interactions are invited to participate in the conference. Platform presentation is not a requirement for attendance. News from BalticWay/Tallinn

Institute of Cybernetics and Department of Meteorology, University of Stockholm organized a two-week intense course in TRACMASS trajectory simulation system in the framework of WP3 of the BalticWay project on 14-24 July 2009. This software, developed and maintained mainly by Kristofer Döös (MISU), is the key tool for analyzing the patterns of current-induced transport of water particles and pollution based on precomputed data from circulation models for the Baltic Sea.
